Rahns Station by Steve Mallon

Some people may or may not know that the trail they cross to enter the club property (PLS) was once part of the Perkiomen Railroad, est. 1865, which later on in 1945 officially became the Perkiomen branch of the Reading Railroad. During the heyday of the Perkiomen Railroad there were 28 stations along the 38.5 mile line starting in Oaks and interchanging in Allentown just outside of Emmaus. One of those stations was the Rahns station that was located just a little ways past our very own Rahns station, even though our trains are a little smaller. Even though I can't 100% confirm it, rumor has it that after the station was removed it became a cabin along the Perkiomen creek but was unfortunately washed away in a flood. The picture in this article is a very rare photo of the inside of the station from the Perkiomen line. The following paragraph was provided by Darren Clossin (photo also provided by Mr. Clossin on the Perkiomen Railroad Facebook group)



1908 - Station Master Fred Buhman at work in the Rahns Station, Ironbridge, PA. He would later work at the Schwenksville station. He lived from 1884-1982. We lived next door to him and I remember being about 5 years old and we kids would knock on his door and he'd give us cookies!
