We all know that it can be difficult to be a participant in an activity if you're not sure what you can do to help out or who to speak to about becoming involved. The actions we have taken has

been to review the list of all active projects at every membership meeting, this is why it is important for all members to attend the monthly membership meetings. All active projects have a named project lead person to make it easier for anyone that is interested in a given project to have a point of contact. The project list with some details and the contact name has also appeared in a number of PLS Gazettes. We will continue the project list concept along with a lead person for each project throughout 2017. If you're not sure about who to contact, you can always come and see me and I will be happy to help you find out who to contact and review the project details. The following is our current project list:

- 1. Core Wall Restack and Tie Curbing – Tie Curbing COM-PLETED, Critical part of Core Restack COMPLETE. Lower part East end of Core Wall still needs work, will be worked on as manpower allows, most likely later in 2017. Skills required: Able to lift and move $\sim 20-25$ pound Core Cylinders. Lead: Bruce Saylor and Frank Webb
- 2. Porch Extension – Slab Complete, all material required to complete will be onsite mid-February. Trusses need to be built, parts (Lumber) needs to be pre-painted, upright framing needs to be assembled, and roof components need to be installed, finish painting. Skills required: Material moving, Painting, carpentry work, Hammer and nail, labor. Lead: Frank Webb
- 1 1/2" (7 1/4" Gauge) Yard to 3. **Mainline Switch and Signals**

(North side 7 ¹/₄" Station) – New electric switch, push buttons and logic control for merge of 7 1/4" yard to 7 1/4" mainline. Project is $\sim 50\%$ complete, push buttons placement, field wiring and logic circuit needs to be added. Skills required: Small concrete bases, pull wire, knowledge of PLS signal and switch system. Lead: Ron Henderson

- 1" (4 ³/₄ Gauge) Switches and 4. Signaling at Brown Box -Switches need repair, isolation from track circuit and Jumpers around isolation. Most (80%) of signal components and circuits are in place. One additional signal head and supporting circuit is still required. Skills required: Digging track side stone for new conduit, track work, wire pulling, knowledge of PLS signal circuit. Lead: Ron Shupard and Frank Webb
- Backhoe Lean-to Shed roof 5. east side of BLDG. 3. Skills, basic wood working, general labor. Status: Not Started. Lead: Paul Quirk
- Caboose Paint Restoration -6. Initial investigation has found south side paint is beyond compounding/buffing. No work completed. Skills required: Metal preparation/painting or find a paint contractor. Lead: TBA
- 7. 4³/₄" Track repair Ongoing work to replace worn rain and rotted ties around 4 ³/₄" mainline track. Status: Work is underway, more to be completed. Skills required: General track work and labor. Lead Jim Miller

8. Repair Twin Tunnel stone facing – Friend of PLS Norm Leping has COMPLETED the work.

The most significant item on our project list is the "Porch Extension" due to the cost, size and manpower required by the time you read this article all the materials required to complete this addition will be onsite. Weather permitting we hope to have this project completed before the Spring Meet, May 26th, 2017. It is a lofty goal!

Most of the projects above can be categorized as physical projects, but behind the scenes other projects are also underway and although not "physical" in the way of hammer and nail, they do require significant time and effort. You might remember seeing a PLS Gazette message from me asking for someone to help organize our library. It was also a subject of business at several of our membership meetings. I am very pleased to tell you that one of our newer members, Joe Gotlewski, has volunteered to help organize our library and make an effort to let our membership know about the many books and videos it has to offer. Another project that is underway is the updating of the PLS Handbook. It has been many, many years since our Handbook was last revised. Bob Blackson has been working on the update for several months and it is no easy task. Even when Bob has completed his work, others will need to provide updates and corrections to the PLS wheel standards and other technical information. This will also require new tables and drafting work. Another ongoing project is the keeping of our membership list. This list contains over 300 names with membership status, addresses, telephone numbers and e-mail

addresses. The list has the most significant change at the beginning of each new fiscal year and then requires monthly updates as member status changes, Associate Members are added, e-mail and mailing address and other information changes. The Regular Member in the background that makes these changes is Kathy Parris. Our soda machine is rarely found empty thanks to Pete Brown who services the machine, takes care of the bill changer, buys the soda and water and keeps the machine filled. We all owe a very appreciative THANK YOU to these people and all that do volunteer work.

In less than three months on Sunday April 23rd, 2017 we will be having our first run day at the PLS railroad. I am sure you are as excited as I am that the new running season that is just around the corner.
